But... Why do we need a resume?

For you

A resume is a powerful tool you can use to organize your thoughts about your activities, and think about the overall portrait you want to portray as a student. You can adjust your resume to really represent yourself on paper, from the words you choose to the design you opt for.

For others

When somebody reads your resume, they are getting a sneak peak at who you are. You can think of this as a movie trailer. If they like the trailer, they will want to watch the movie! Your goal is to stand out and make them want to meet you in person through your resume.

So where do you begin when making your own resume?

If you are in high school (9th grade or over), you should list every activity you have participated in since 9th grade. This can be during the school year or during summer!

Let's think about activities using these categories:

- Music & Arts
- Clubs & Organizations
- Athletics
- Academics
- Internships & Jobs
- Volunteering

Next, we look at your activities

An "activity" is pretty much anything you do outside of class!

Now that you have the list of your activities...

Step 1: Title and time

The first thing you should do when listing your activities is to note down the title and the time period you did it. It's good to have the start time, end time, number of hours per week, and number of weeks per year.

Step 2: What did I do?

This is where you get to explain what your duties and responsibilities were. Don't overthink this, just give us a background of what happened. What was your task or goal? How did you achieve it?

Step 3: Lessons learned

What lessons did you learn throughout this process? You should focus on skills you demonstrated. Maybe you showed teamwork, or communication, or dedication, or critical thinking, or creativity.

Be bold!

The final result should look like this:

[Activity Name]
[Time Period]
[What did I do?] + [What did I learn?]

And when it comes to compiling your awards, just follow the exact same process!
